



## Galette Chambon Projects and Ministry Guide

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### Ongoing Mission Team Ministries

- Child Sponsorship Program Outreach
  - Visit with sponsored children while assisting BGM in collecting data: picture, measurements, interview questions for sponsor updates.
  - Visit homes, deliver gifts, and pray with families
  - Have a sponsor party for the sponsored children and their families sponsored by your team
  - Take/print out school or family photos
- English Classes
  - Assist Haitian teacher with class activities, play games or use movies to teach English
  - English learner game night for 20-25 children one night during your trip. Learn new words and practice conversation
  - Small Classes of 20-25 daily (children or adults) at the Hope Center, play games and do activities to practice speaking English

**Class uses the *Oxford Picture Dictionary English – Haitian Creole: Bilingual Dictionary* (available from Amazon.com)**
- Children's Ministries
  - Vacation Bible School – After school at the Hope Center. Teach: Bible stories, New songs and games, team building activities, and very simple crafts, if any.
  - Assist serving lunch at schools
  - Small classes of 20-30 children at the Hope Center for arts and crafts, Bible lessons, etc.
  - Play games or do activities with kids after lunch at the school (summer only)
  - Orphanage Children's Ministry – such as VBS after school
  - School Visits in mornings or to assist serving lunch during your trip. You can prepare a short lesson to teach as a guest, or prepare recreational activities for when school is out.
- Evangelism – daily at Medical Clinic
  - minister to children and adults in the waiting area or in the prayer garden
  - integrate into the intake and triage teams to identify/discuss any spiritual counseling needs
- Evangelism in the Village – village walks to visit and pray with families
- Bible Studies – men, women, children/youth
- Motherhood Seminars – daily in the mornings during your trip for 20-25 ladies. No professional training required, just a willingness to mentor soon to be or new mothers on topics such as pregnancy, childbirth, breastfeeding, newborn care, nutrition, child development and illnesses and discipline. We have a resource folder with specific class information for you to follow and/or how team members can assist Haitian staff/missionary with support, quizzing, gift items, snacks, devotions, etc.
- Malnutrition Center Support
  - Assist with caring for children, preparing meals
  - Nutrition education and Bible Study opportunities with parents
- Medical
  - Nutrition Program

- Identify malnourished patients
- Educate identified patients
- Organize and distribute food (Manapacks)
- Monitor compliance and progress
- Teach nutrition education in school
- Teach motherhood classes
- Conduct home visits with data collection
- Community Education
  - Educational Seminars at the schools – topics such as clean water usage, hygiene, etc.
  - Teach patients in the clinic waiting area daily about clean water usage and other topics related to health issues facing the community
  - Seminars for patients about managing common issues – for example blood pressure
- Doctors, Dentists, Nurses, Pharmacists, Physical Therapists, and other Allied Health Professionals
  - Triage and take vitals
  - Integrate with clinic staff seeing patients
- Non-medical professionals:
  - Assist Haitian staff in making patient ID cards and with data entry for patients
  - Work alongside staff doctors and nurses – assist with vitals and simple tests
  - Pharmacy - record keeping and distribution

## Construction

- House construction (\$5,885) - Building a house alongside a family and local construction team
- Church office – Build a small addition to the Galette Chambon church – Approx \$5,000
- Economic Development construction – various small projects for the Sewing Business, Auto Parts Store, and Beauty Salon – email Beth for details on any of these projects
- Hope Center, Malnutrition Center, and Orphanage – repair/maintenance needs
- Hope Center – remodel/expand kitchen, bathroom and showers
- School construction projects - using Haitian work teams\*:
  - Build a classroom – Approx \$4,500
  - Build an office – Approx \$5,000
  - School benches/desks for schools - \$150 per desk. Team brings hardware.
  - Teacher desks and chairs for schools – \$150 per desk. Team brings hardware.
  - Small tables: \$100/each
  - Chalkboards: \$100/each
  - Miscellaneous repair/maintenance needs at schools
  - Water collection system at schools
- Other community ministry construction projects - using Haitian work teams\*:
  - Building new beds for families - \$350/bed (including mattress). Team brings hardware.
  - Gutters and rain barrels for homes in Galette Chambon - \$270/each house
  - Building tables and benches for houses - \$110/each
  - Repair needs for homes in the village – for example, roof repairs
  - Special construction needs for handicap ministry – such as ramps, beds at homes
- Painting – houses or classrooms: houses \$150/each, team brings 2 brushes and 4 roller covers per house\*

\*Haitian work teams – This ministry opportunity provides a job for up to 5 Haitians while your team is here – they will be hired to work with your team to assist with projects – sanding, staining, etc. The amount of workers/days to be hired is determined by your team’s project plans. Each worker is paid \$8/day, for a maximum of \$200. Please indicate on your team’s final planning update your willingness to hire Haitians and **please take cash** to Haiti for this part of your project fees. (Please consult Tony West during your trip about the appropriate form to complete regarding donating cash to BGM while in Haiti.)

- Malnutrition Center construction projects:

- Screening all windows and doors and build screen doors for front doors
- Scrape, seal, and paint ceilings in missionary house
- Build seating area and pallet gardens on roof
- Build compost bin
- Repaint front porch
- Build nurses station
- Purchase and install ceiling fans

## Mechanical

- Engine, maintenance, HVAC, electrical
  - Train BGM staff on mechanical maintenance
  - Develop a maintenance program
  - Be available to address maintenance “handyman” needs during your trip

## Teaching

- Educational Seminars at the schools – topics such as clean water usage, hygiene, helping others, trash control, planting trees, etc...or specific skills of team members such as teaching English, foreign language, art, etc.
- Teacher Mentoring Program
  - Teacher Training workshops – Teach classroom management skills, new teaching methods, etc. Rote memorization is common and new ideas need to be implemented through practice - teach and *practice* integrating these new teaching methods and skills into the classroom, such as making and using discipline plans posters in rooms and using interactive teaching activities with children in the classroom
  - Create classroom educational partnerships with US schools
- Community Education
  - Educational Seminars at the schools – topics such as clean water usage, hygiene, etc.
  - Teach patients in the clinic waiting area daily about clean water usage and other topics related to health issues facing the community
- Bible Studies/Evangelism and Discipleship
  - Men’s Bible study
  - Pastor’s Conference
  - Ladies’ Bible study – Craft projects are great for these Bible studies
  - Marriage and Family Conference
  - Hope Center Employees (men/women)
  - Malnutrition Center staff and moms
  - Teen girl’s or boy’s Bible Study
  - Youth Evangelism Conference
  - Church youth equipping – teach church youth to lead VBS lessons
  - Vacation Bible School (community wide) – After school at the GC Church: Teach Bible stories/lessons, new songs, (Suggest very simple English songs that can be translated ahead of time into Creole) new games, team building activities, simple crafts, if any.
- Bible Storytelling
  - Oral Bible storytelling is an effective way to share God’s Word with Haitians. And you can help Haitians to memorize and tell Bible stories, for example, to lead the VBS lesson.

- Hobbies – Teach jewelry, soap making, sewing skills, etc. for business development
- Other team member skills and abilities that can be taught
- Orphanage care
  - Games and Songs
  - Teaching assistance
  - Reading to children

- English Classes
  - Assist Haitian teacher with class activities, play games or use movies to teach English
  - Before the trip, create individual folder games/flashcards using any vocabulary from the *Oxford Picture Dictionary English – Haitian Creole: Bilingual Dictionary* (available from Amazon.com) for students to use to learn new groups of vocabulary words. Pick a topic, make a game, and store in a folder.
  - English learner game night for 20-25 children one night during your trip. Learn new words and practice conversation
  - Small Classes of 20-25 daily (children or adults) at the Hope Center, play games and do activities to practice speaking English

- Additional teaching opportunities under Medical and other skill areas

## Sports

- Children's sports camps – integrate into schools or community with organized teams for sports teaching activities  
And prepared devotional time
- Orphanage Care – games and sports

## Business

- BGM network systems monitoring and updates
- Business skills mentoring – One on One or Seminars through BGM's *Business Development Center*
  - Excel, Word, Budgeting, Marketing planning/Supply Chain Management, Social media strategies
  - Misc. book keeping computer skills
- Business development
  - Develop locally owned businesses: Sewing, Beauty Salon, Business Services Center, Bakery, etc.
  - Mentor new and existing business owners – topics such as inventory, record keeping, money management
  - Identify new opportunities for businesses

## Agriculture

- Community Garden - planting, weeding, fertilizing, and harvesting
- Landscaping in the church courtyard (after fencing installed – see “**Construction**” projects above)
- Farm planning
  - Crop selection and methods
  - Chickens
- Irrigation - maintenance and repair

## Supplies needed:
